Applicant requests that her late husband's record be changed to reflect 20 satisfactory years of Federal service. Applicant's submission is at Exhibit A.


The appropriate Air Force office evaluated applicant's request and provided an advisory opinion to the Board recommending the application be denied (Exhibit C). The advisory opinion was forwarded to the applicant for review and response (Exhibit D). Applicant's response to the advisory opinion is at Exhibit E.

After careful consideration of applicant's request and her deceased husband's available evidence of record, we find insufficient evidence of error or injustice to warrant corrective action. The facts and opinions stated in the advisory opinion appear to be based on the evidence of record and have not been adequately rebutted by applicant. Absent persuasive evidence applicant's late husband was denied rights to which entitled, appropriate regulations were not followed, or appropriate standards were not applied, we find no basis to disturb the existing record.

Accordingly, applicant's request is denied.

The Board staff is directed to inform applicant of this decision. Applicant should also be informed that this decision is final and will only be reconsidered upon the presentation of new relevant evidence which was not reasonably available at the time the application was filed.

Members of the Board Mr. Vaughn E. Schlunz, Mr. Richard A. Peterson, and Mr. Patrick R. Wheeler considered this application on 29 September 1998 in accordance with the provisions of Air Force Instruction 36-2603, and the governing statute, 10, U.S.C. 1552.

1. The requested correction cannot be accomplished administratively at this headquarters.
2. The applicant **has requested** [REDACTED] record be changed to reflect 20 satisfactory years of Federal service [REDACTED].
3. The following is an analysis of the circumstances surrounding this case:
 - a. The [REDACTED] was initially enlisted in the United States Air Force (USAF) on 10 June 1952 and was released on 11 June 1956. Service in the USAF is creditable towards satisfactory Federal service. The [REDACTED] was then assigned to the United States Air Force Reserve (USAFR) non-participating, Obligated Reserve Section (ORS) until 11 January 1958. While assigned to ORS, members are awarded membership points only.
 - b. On 12 June 1958, the [REDACTED] was assigned to a USAFR unit in a participating status until 7 October 1963. Although assigned to a participating status, the [REDACTED] did not earn the required 50 points for a year of satisfactory Federal service for retirement years ending (RYE) 11 June 1959 and 11 June 1960.
 - c. The [REDACTED] reenlisted in the USAF on 8 October 1963 and was discharged 13 October 1967.
 - d. From 14 October 1967 to 3 May 1968 the [REDACTED] was in a civilian status.
 - e. On 4 May 1968, the [REDACTED] enlisted in a USAFR unit in a participating status until 31 July 1973. The [REDACTED] earned the required 50 points for the RYE 3 May 1969 through 3 May 1973.
 - f. The [REDACTED] was reassigned from [REDACTED] participating reserve unit to the Non-affiliated Reserve Section (NARS) on 1 August 1973 and remained there until [REDACTED] discharge on 4 May 1974. While assigned to NARS, members are awarded membership points only.

g. The [redacted] accrued a total of **16 years, 4 months, 2 days** of satisfactory Federal service as of **4 May 1974**. Attached is an **ARPC Form 168** showing a year-by-year breakdown of the member's service history [redacted]

4. Recommend this application be disapproved. Under the provisions of Title **10, U.S.C Section 12731**, to be eligible for retired pay at age 60, a member must complete **20** years of satisfactory Federal service.

5. If the board rules in favor of the applicant, the following actions would be necessary:

a. For RYE **11 June 1958**, award **35** non-paid Inactive Duty Training (IDT) points. [redacted] record would then show **0** Active Duty (AD) points, **35** IDT points, **0** Extension Course Institute (ECI) points, **15** membership points, **50** total and retirement points, and a year of satisfactory Federal service.

b. For RYE **11 June 1959**, award **13** non-paid IDT points. [redacted] record would then show **0** AD points, **35** IDT points, **0** ECI points, **15** membership points, **50** total and retirement points, and a year of satisfactory Federal service.

c. For RYE **11 June 1960**, award **30** non-paid IDT points. [redacted] record would then show **0** AD points, **35** IDT points, **0** ECI points, **15** membership points, **50** total and retirement points, and a year of satisfactory Federal service.

d. For RYE **3 March 1974**, award **29** non-paid IDT points. [redacted] record would then show **2** AD points, **33** IDT points, **0** ECI points, **15** membership points, **50** total and retirement points, and a year of satisfactory Federal service.
