

SUBJECT: Application for [redacted] of Military Records [redacted]

Requested Action and Basis for Request. Restore 4 days lost at FY98 year-end balancing. Applicant states mission requirements prevented him from using these days.

Facts and Discussion. Applicant had 56 days on 1 Oct 97, used 22 day, and had 64 days on 30 Sep 98. He lost 4 days on 1 Oct 98 because under 10 USC 701 members cannot carry more than 60 days into the next FY. The applicant states he was unable to take scheduled leave on 8-11 Sep 98 due to participation as a member of a safety investigation board at [redacted] AFB [redacted]. He states his commander notified him of the board participation on 1 Sep. He departed [redacted] AFB [redacted] on 2 Sep and returned to [redacted] AFB [redacted] on 30 Sep. In this case, we support granting relief because applicant was unable to take 4 days due to military requirements.

Recommendation. Approve restoring 4 days to current leave account.
