1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected by removing the fitness reports for 25 November 1986 to 1 February 1987, 7 March to 31 October 1987, and 1 November 1987 to 14 July 1988, copies of which are at Tabs A through C respectively. As indicated in enclosure (2), the Headquarters Marine Corps (HQMC) Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB) has directed removal of the contested fitness reports. Petitioner further requested removal of his failure of selection by the Fiscal Year (FY) 2000 Lieutenant Colonel Selection Board, so as to be considered by the selection to that grade. Finally, he requested that if he is selected by the FY 2001 Lieutenant Colonel Selection Board, and effective date as a lieutenant colonel he says he would have received from the FY 2000 promotion board. This request was not considered, since he has not been selected or promoted to lieutenant colonel.

2. The Board, consisting of Messrs. Brezna, Mazza, and Silberman, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 29 September 1999, and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. In correspondence attached as enclosure (3), the HQMC office having cognizance over the subject matter of Petitioner's request to strike his failure of selection for promotion has commented to the effect that this request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (3), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

a. That Petitioner's record be corrected so that he will be considered by the earliest possible selection board convened to consider officers of his category for promotion to lieutenant colonel as an officer who has not failed of selection for promotion to that grade.

b. That any material or entries inconsistent with or relating to the Board's recommendation be corrected, removed or completely expunged from Petitioner's record and that no such entries or material be added to the record in the future.

c. That any material directed to be removed from Petitioner's naval record be returned to the Board, together with a copy of this Report of Proceedings, for retention in a confidential file maintained for such purpose, with no cross reference being made a part of Petitioner's naval record.

4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(c)) it is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

It will also state that such boards may not conjecture or draw any inference as to the nature of the reports or the events which may have precipitated them, unless such events are otherwise properly a part of the official record. The Automated Fitness Report System (the data base which generates your Master Brief Sheet) will be corrected accordingly.

3. The Commandant of the Marine Corps is not empowered to grant or deny the removal of failure(s) of selection from a Naval record. Accordingly, your case will be forwarded to the Board for Correction of Naval Records (BCNR) for consideration of that issue.

1. Recommend approval of the request for removal of his failure of selection. This recommendation gives him the benefit of the doubt.

2. Per the reference, we reviewed for and selection on the FY00 Lieutenant Colonel Selection Board and subsequently successfully petitioned the Performance Evaluation Review Board (PERB) for removal of the Temporary Duty fitness report of 861125 to 870201, Annual report of 870307 to 871031 and Change of Reporting Senior report of 871101 to 880714.

3. In our opinion, the petitioned fitness reports do present significant competitive concern to the record and their removal enhances the competitiveness of the record. While we recognize the record contains other areas of competitive concern, we believe the record should be afforded the benefit of the doubt and have
