This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of Title 10, United States Code, Section 1552.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 5 October 1999. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, your naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice.

The Board found you enlisted in the Navy on 24 October 1989 at the age of 18. Your record shows that you served a year without disciplinary incident, but on 7 September 1990 you received nonjudicial punishment (NJP) for two incidents of dishonorable failure to pay just debts. The punishment imposed was an oral reprimand, correctional custody for 30 days, and forfeitures totalling \$810. On 7 December 1990 you were convicted by summary court-martial (SCM) of damaging military property, five incidents of larceny and wrongful appropriation, and housebreaking. You were sentenced to confinement for 30 days, forfeitures totalling \$483, and reduction to paygrade E-1.

On 19 February 1991 you were notified of pending administrative separation action by reason of misconduct due to commission of a serious offense. At this time you waived your rights to consult with legal counsel, to submit a statement in rebuttal to the separation, or to present your case to an administrative discharge board. On 22 February 1991 your commanding officer recommended you be issued an other than honorable discharge by
