Subj: FORMER REVIEW OF NAVAL RECORD

1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that his naval record be corrected to show that he was assigned a reenlistment code which will permit him to reenlist.

2. The Board, consisting of Ms. Moidel and Messrs. Harrison and Pfeiffer, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 31 May 2001 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Docu nentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Although, it appears that enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to waive the statute of limitations and review the application on its merits.

c. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy on 31 July 1996. On 22 November 1996, he reported symptoms of claustrophobia, and disclosed a lengthy history of that condition. He was considered unsuitable for service because of the claustrophobia, and was recommended for discharge on that basis. Due to apparent administrative oversight, he was discharged by reason of a personality disorder, and assigned a reenlistment code of RE-4, as required by separation directives.

d. Petitioner contends, in effect, that his claustrophobic symptoms were related to a
