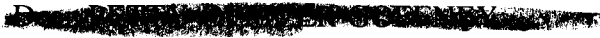

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of title 10 of the United States Code, section 1552.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 11 September 2001. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion furnished by BUPERS memorandum 5420 PERS 862 of 16 August 2001, a copy of which is attached.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found that the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the advisory opinion. Accordingly, your application has been denied. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request.

It is regretted that the circumstances of your case are such that favorable action cannot be taken. You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new and material evidence or other matter not previously considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.

1. Per reference (a), the following comments and recommendations are submitted concerning Petty Officer [REDACTED]'s case.

2. Petty Officer [REDACTED]'s February 2000 (Cycle 066) Navywide Advancement Examination for HM1 had a Performance Mark (PMA) Error that has not been corrected to date. After a review of her records, it is determined that Petty Officer [REDACTED]'s PMA for Cycle 066 was 3.67, which would have given her an additional 75.5 points on the Navywide Advancement Examination for Cycle 066. With the additional 75.5 points, Petty Officer [REDACTED]'s Final Multiple Score (FMS) computes to 174.33. The FMS that was required for selection to HM1 is 200.08. Petty Officer [REDACTED]'s Final Multiple Score falls 25.75 points short of being a selectee for advancement.

3. In view of the above, we recommend Petty Officer [REDACTED]'s petition be denied.
