1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected to show that government travel was authorized when he was reassigned to Guam.
2. The Board, consisting of Messrs Dunn, Neuschafer, and Ms Schnittman, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 14 November 2001 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
  - a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
  - b. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

#### CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

a. The orders reassigning Petitioner to Guam were modified to show that government travel was "authorized" vice "directed". Petitioner will be reimbursed for his travel not exceed what it would have cost the government for the travel to Guam. (NOTE: Petitioner should go to the closest facility which can compute travel vouchers and ask them to compute monies due for this action. Petitioner must present to the Agency computing the money due a copy of all previous vouchers pertaining to the travel to Guam and a copy of this action. **The Agency making the computation will not make the actual payment.** Petitioner will then forward the computation of monies due, a copy of this letter and all other vouchers pertaining to the travel to DFAS-DE/POCC, 6760 E. Irvington Place, Denver, CO 80279-7100.)

b. Petitioner was furnished a certificate of "nonavailability" of a U. S. flag carrier.

c. That a copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(c)) it is certified that quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
