

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of title 10 of the United States Code, section 1552.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 16 October 2002. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion furnished by NPC memorandum 1160 Ser 811/409 of 25 September 2002, a copy of which is attached.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found that the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the advisory opinion. Accordingly, your application has been denied. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request.

It is regretted that the circumstances of your case are such that favorable action cannot be taken. You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new and material evidence or other matter not previously considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.

1. In response to reference (a), recommend disapproval of petitioner's request.

a. The petitioner reenlisted on 15 October 2000 for six years and received a zone "A" SRB entitlement for the ETSW(0000) rate.

b. The petitioner request STAR program eligibility for the reenlistment of 15 October 2000.

c. Per reference (b), automatic advancement is authorized if the "C" school or "C" school package the service member completed was listed on the Career Schools List (CSL) in effect on the date of reenlistment.

d. The petitioner completed the Small Combatant Communications Electronics Subsystems Technician (NEC 1428) on 11 September 1998. Reference (c) released on 12 July 2000 deleted NEC 1428 from the CSL.

2. In view of the above, recommend the petitioner's record remain as is.
