1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected by restoring his name to the Temporary Disability Retired List (TDRL).

2. The Board, consisting of Messrs. Chapman, Spooner and Swarens, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 19 March 2015 and pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Enclosure (1) was filed in a timely manner.

c. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the Navy Personnel Command (NPC) office having cognizance over Sailors whose names are carried on the TDRL recommends, in effect, that Petitioner's name be restored to the TRDL and that he be afforded a final periodic examination followed by referral to the Physical Evaluation Board for a final determination of his disability status.

CONCLUSION:


Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

a. That Petitioner's naval record be corrected by restoring his name to the TDRL and according him a final periodic examination followed by referral to the Physical Evaluation Board for a final determination of his disability status.

b. That a copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
