- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a) Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected to compare the August 2015 Cycle 097 Navy Wide Advancement Examination (NWAE) against Cycles 092 through 096.
- 2. The Board, consisting of reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 1 February 2017 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
- a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
- b. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and partial favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board agrees with the recommendations contained in reference (b) that once the Petitioner takes the E-5 exam that he should petition the Board for Correction of Naval Records (BCNR) to have the exam graded against the exams that were missed. After comparing Cycles 093 through 096, the Petitioner did not meet the minimum Final Multiple

Score (FMS) to be advance to CE2. Comparison between Cycle 092 and 097 could not be completed due to no Performance Mark Average (PMA) could be established because the Petitioner does not having an evaluation within the inclusive dates. The Board agrees with the advisory opinion in that finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

- a. To compare the August 2015 Cycle 097 NWAE against Cycles 093 through 096. Note: The Petitioner did not meet the minimum Final Multiple Score (FMS) to be advance to CE2.
- b. In so far as Petitioner's request for corrective action that exceeds the foregoing, the Board concurred with the advisory opinion. Note: The comparison of Cycle 097 to Cycle 092 could not be approved due to no PMA could be established due to not having an evaluation within the inclusive dates.
 - c. A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
- 4. It is certified that quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
