This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Title 10, United States Code, Section 1552. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 29 October 2020. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

On 6 June 2018, you were issued official separation orders (BUPERS order: 1578). You were charged leave from 18 October 2018 to 27 October 2018 (10 days). You were charged leave from 29 October 2018 to 26 November 2018 (29 days). On 1 October 2018, you brought forward 35.5 days. From 1 October 2018 to 26 November 2018, you earned 5 days leave, giving you a total of 40.5 days. You subsequently used 39 days, for a remaining balance of 1.5 days leave, for which you received \$304.17 lump sum leave (LSL) payment. On 26 November 2018, you resigned upon completion of required active service.

You requested a LSL payment for roughly 9 days of unused leave upon discharge effective 26 November 2018; the Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that you are not owed 9 days of LSL. The Board also concluded that you received payment for 1.5 days of LSL; however, block 16 (Days accrued leave paid) of your DD Form 214 should reflect 1.5 vice NONE. This can be corrected by submitting a request to Commander, Navy Personnel Command (PERS 312), 5720 Integrity Drive, Millington, TN 38055-3120. A correction request



must contain the full name, rank/rate, social security number, periods of service and current mailing address. Provide a copy of this letter with your request.

It is regretted that the circumstances of your case are such that favorable action cannot be taken. You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
