Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant as of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

c. On 9 June 2016, confirmed Petitioner met the Navy's credentialing requirements for entry into U.S. Naval Service as a	
d.	On 23 February 2017, Petitioner signed his oath of office into the U. S. Navy.



e. On 29 April 2017, Petitioner entered active duty and assigned to temporary duty.

f. Petitioner was assigned to Navy Medical Center, through 14 July 2020. Petitioner began practicing as a property on 23 August 2017.

g. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. In accordance with reference (b), Petitioner met the eligibility criteria for HPO IP; however, because of administrative oversight, Petitioner's HPO IP package was not submitted accordingly; therefore, the Board felt that under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner submitted HPO IP request package in a timely manner, and was approved by cognizant authority.

This change will entitle Petitioner to HPO IP with an annual rate of \$5,000 for the period of 23 August 2017 to 17 June 2020. Note: Defense Finance and Accounting Service will conduct an audit of Petitioner's pay records to determine retroactive pay entitlement.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

- 5.
