This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 27 July 2021. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

You requested to establish a satisfactory year for anniversary year ending 15 March 2020. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. The Board concluded Marine Corps Order 1001.RL outlines the requirements to maintain a qualifying year of service for retirement, the fiscal year satisfactory participation requirements, and the methods of fulfilling participation requirements. A review of your record indicates during anniversary year ending 15 March 2020, you earned 37 inactive points to include 15 membership points and you received 12 active duty points for the Annual Training (AT) orders executed 19 February 2020 through 1 March 2020. However, the Board determined, because you did not complete sufficient drills prior to the end of your anniversary year, you did not earn the required 50 point minimum to garner a qualifying year of service; not as a result of delayed processing of your AT orders. Additionally, the Board noted Reserve members are responsible for tracking their inactive and active participation to ensure they meet the points required to get a satisfactory year.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in

mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
