

On 17 July 2015, you transferred, and arrived to [REDACTED] duty. In 1 August 2016, you earned NEC 3355. On 19 December 2016, you were issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: 3546), with an ultimate activity for duty at [REDACTED]

You requested that your bonus be changed to the \$100,000 cap and receive back pay; the Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that you were awarded skill set MMNSS/3355 for submarines in August 2016, after executing your reenlistment contract. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the advisory opinion.

The Board determined that your personal appearance, with or without counsel, would not materially add to their understanding of the issues involved. Therefore, the Board determined that a personal appearance was not necessary and considered your case based on the evidence of record.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
