



- 1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to reflect Home of Record (HOR) as vice ...
- 2. The Board, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 26 October 2021 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of enclosures (1) through (11), relevant portions of Petitioner's naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
- 3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:
- a. In accordance with reference (b), correction to the HOR may be authorized when, there is a bona fide error with the place originally named at time of current entry into the Service was not in fact the actual home or a break in service that exceeds one full day.



BOARD CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and notwithstanding the contents of enclosure (10), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. In this regard, the Board concluded Petitioner met the basic eligibility criteria to elect HOR in California; however, under incorrect guidance elected his father's address as HOR. The Board found that had Petitioner received proper guidance, he would have elected the correct location for his HOR at time of enlistment. Therefore, the Board felt under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

BOARD RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's enlistment documents (DD Form 4, Enlistment/Reenlistment Document and DD Form 1966, Record of Military Processing) dated 4 August 2016 are amended to reflect HOR as "vice"

- 4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.
- 5. The foregoing action of the Board is submitted for your review and action.
