f. Petitioner divorced [REDACTED] on 14 January 2014. Judgement of Divorce ordered RCSBP Former Spouse coverage.

g. Petitioner was married to [REDACTED] from 31 January 2016 through 8 June 2020.

h. Petitioner transferred to the Retired Reserve with pay effective 28 August 2020 and RCSBP and Survivor Benefit Plan Spouse premium deductions began with [REDACTED] listed as the annuitant.

#### CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner failed to elect RCSBP Former Spouse coverage as directed by the Judgement of Divorce in a timely manner. Although Petitioner did not complete the proper administrative requirements, the Board felt that under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner changed RCSBP election from "Spouse" to "Former Spouse" coverage naming [REDACTED] as the beneficiary, at the full gross pay level of coverage, within 1-year of date of divorce on 14 January 2014.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.
