1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a) Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting his naval record be corrected to show Petitioner was credited with 14 days leave that were charged during Restriction of Movement (ROM).

2. The Board, consisting of █, █, and █, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 14 December 2021 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. On 12 February 2021, Petitioner was issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: █) while stationed in █ with an effective date of departure of February 2021. Ultimate activity was █ for duty with an effective date of arrival of April 2021.

c. In accordance with reference (b), this NAVADMIN supersedes NAVADMIN 083/20 and acknowledges that operational unit commanders may have to execute a Restriction of Movement (ROM) period prior to introducing new members to the crew or prior to taking a unit overseas or underway. It also designates additional responsibilities for Transient Personnel Unit (TPU) Commanding Officers and clarifies use of Hardship Duty Pay (HDP)-ROM as a source of

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funding for ROM. Under Secretary of Defense memo requires personnel returning from a Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Travel Health Notice (THN) Level 3 or Level 2 location perform a 14-day ROM. During ROM, Service Members should be restricted to their residence or other appropriate domicile and limit close contact (within 6 feet or 2 meters) with others. This NAVADMIN clarifies the definition of ROM, provides amplifying guidance, and delineates responsibilities for execution of ROM.

- d. On 12 March 2021, Petitioner transferred from [REDACTED].
- e. On 29 March 2021, Petitioner arrived to [REDACTED] for temporary duty under instruction.
- f. On 9 April 2021, Petitioner was charged leave from 12 March 2021 to 27 March 2021 (16 days).
- g. On 15 April 2021, Petitioner was issued official change duty orders (BUPERS order: [REDACTED]) while stationed in [REDACTED] with an effective date of departure of September 2021. Ultimate activity was [REDACTED] for duty with an effective date of arrival of September 2021.
- h. On 16 April 2021, Petitioner graduated from INFORMATION DOMINANCE BAS CR.
- i. On 8 September 2021, Petitioner graduated from INFORMATION PROFESSIONAL BAS.
- j. On 8 September 2021, Petitioner transferred, and arrived to [REDACTED] on 14 September 2021 for duty.
- k. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner conducted ROM in his personal residence prior to checking in to IWTC [REDACTED]. Although his ROM method was accepted and he was allowed to start his course of instruction on time, leave was erroneously charged. There are no receipts in his case file because he was in his local personal residence. Petitioner's leave that was charged while he was conducting ROM should be credited back to the Petitioner.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

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Petitioner was credited with 14 days leave while executing ROM at his personal residence effective 12 March 2021.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
