



and Additional Comments): “Directed Comment: Annual report omitted per chapter 3, paragraph 4.j (2) of MCO1610.7A.” The Board also noted the contested RS statement and determined that the PES Manual authorizes RSs to make references to their profile dynamics and to include comments that provide a more complete and detailed evaluation of the Marine’s professional character. The Board also determined that the PES Manual does not provide a scale to match RS comments with attribute markings and found no evidence that the Section I comments conflict with or obscure the evaluation of your performance and conduct. Accordingly, the Board concluded that there is no probable material error, substantive inaccuracy, or injustice warranting corrective action.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
