1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish Petitioner's authorization for modification of BUPERS Order 1231 (Official Change Duty Orders) in order to permit submission of household goods (HHG) shipment claim executed on 11 August 2020.

2. The Board, consisting of **Constants**, **Constants**, and **Constants**, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 28 October 2021 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. On 11 August 2020 Petitioner initiated shipment of household goods prior to issuance of BUPERS Order 1231 (Official Change Duty Orders) effective as of 3 May 2021.

b. On 20 July 2021 Petitioner notified by Naval Supply Fleet Logistics Center letter 4600 302/N0H7HZ-31 since HHG shipment was made prior to the issuance of orders, their office has no legal basis to permit payment of his claim.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded per reference (b) HHG allowances are based on the PCS

order's effective and certain criteria must be met in order to execute HHG transportation before an order is issued. The Petitioner failed to meet the requirements and began execution of HHG PPM prior to issuance of orders. To eliminate financial burden for the Petitioner relief is granted.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

BUPERS Order (Official Change Duty Orders) issued 1 August 2020 vice 3 May 2021. Petitioner authorized to submit Household Goods (HHG) claim.

Petitioner will submit a copy of the Board's approval letter to the Navy Household Goods Audit Team with all appropriate HHG documentation and orders to settle his claim. Settlement of move charged against Petitioner's BUPERS Order

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
