Dear █

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

Although your application was not filed in a timely manner, the Board found it in the interest of justice to waive the statute of limitations and consider your case on its merits. A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 9 December 2021. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

You requested your travel debt of \$774.00 be corrected due to the failure of the Naval Special Warfare Command, Basic Training Command, administrative section failure to submit a final travel claim. The Board in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that per DoD 7000.14r Volume 9, travelers are responsible for the preparation and submission the DD Form 1351-2 with all supporting documentation for processing. It is recommended you pull BUPERS Order 3014 dated 28 Oct 2014 from your NSIPS ESR Order History to include all modifications of said order; prepare your PCS travel claim and submit it to the Travel Processing Center (TPC), █. If TPC is unable to settle or process the PCS travel claim, you may submit a request for remission of indebtedness by completing and submitting a Waiver/Remission of Indebtedness Application (DD Form 2789), along with supporting documents, to include an explanation from TPC as of why the claim cannot be settled or process to nxag_N130C@navy.mil

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not

previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
