1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish Petitioner's authorization for reimbursement of Port Fees incurred from Philippine port due to his Household Goods (HHG) not being routed as a standard shipment by the personal property shipping office (PPSO).

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████, ██████████, and ██████████, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 2 December 2021 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. On 27 September 2019, Petitioner issued BUPERS Order ██████████ Official Change Duty Orders. Detach PDS ██████████ during Feb 20 with intermediate activities enroute to ultimate activity ██████████. ██████████ estimated date of arrival (EDA) 30 March 2020.

b. On 5 November 2019, Petitioner issued Designated Place of Residency ██████████ by CNO N130C.

c. On 23 January 2020, Petitioner's HHG picked up in ██████████ and arrived in ██████████ 24 March 2020. Personal Property Shipping Office (PPSO) incorrectly booked his shipment as a separate/retiree shipment, the Transportation Service Provider (TSP) believed Petitioner was responsible for his shipment once received at port.

d. Petitioner contends he paid \$5000.00 in miscellaneous port fees order to have HHG shipment released from ██████████ port.

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e. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner authorized reimbursement for fees incurred in order to have HHG released to from Philippine port warranting relief.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's BUPERS Order [REDACTED] Official Change Duty Orders contain authorization of reimbursement of all Port Fees and miscellaneous charges incurred in order to obtain HHG shipment executed via the PPSO.

Petitioner authorized to submit Household Goods (HHG) claim.

Petitioner will submit a copy of the Board's approval letter to the Navy Household Goods Audit Team with all appropriate HHG documentation and orders to settle his claim. Settlement of HHG miscellaneous fees charged against Petitioner's BUPERS Order [REDACTED].

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
