

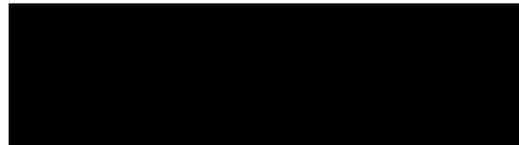


naval message announcing the convening dates for the FY 2022 Navy Reserve Officer PSB was released on 11 March 2021 and contained a reminder that all officers are responsible for ensuring their personnel records are substantially accurate and complete. Additionally, the Board noted the FY 2022 PSB was your third look and concluded you were very aware of your responsibilities for ensuring an accurate and complete OMPF was available for the PSB's review. Lastly, the Board noted the governing instruction requires an officer to demonstrate by a preponderance of the evidence that grounds for convening an SSB exist. Governing instruction also states a "SSB will not be convened to consider any officer who, by maintaining reasonably careful records, could have discovered and taken steps to correct the error or omission in the officer's record before the PSB." Based on the available evidence, the Board determined you did not take reasonable steps to ensure the fitness report was available to the PSB and therefore concluded there was insufficient evidence of an error or injustice to warrant granting your requested relief.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
