CONCLUSION:

Form 214) is in error.

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board concludes Petitioner's request warrants relief.

The Board noted Petitioner's submission of supporting documentation. The Board also noted the servicemember's enlistment contract, his DD Form 214, and the Record of Discharge, Release from Active duty and concluded that Petitioner's request warrants relief in the form of correcting the servicemember's name listed on the DD Form 214 to reflect "" vice "vice "Additionally, the servicemember's date of discharge shall be corrected to reflect "12 January 1957" vice "12 January 1955."

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

That on behalf of the servicemember, Petitioner be issued a DD Form 215 indicating that the servicemember's name reflected as "and the date of discharge was "12 January 1957."

That no further changes be made to servicemember's record.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in servicemember's naval record.
