Dear █:

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 6 January 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion by PERS-312 of 18 November 2021 and your response to the opinion.

In accordance with the Joint Federal Travel Regulations, the Home of Record (HOR) is the place recorded as the home of the individual when commissioned, appointed, enlisted, inducted, or ordered into a tour of active duty. Note 1: The place recorded as the home of the individual when reinstated, reappointed, or reenlisted remains the same as that recorded when commissioned, appointed, enlisted or inducted or ordered into the tour of active duty unless there is a break in service of more than one full day. Only if a break in service exceeds one full day may the member change the HOR.

On 31 August 2021, Commander, Navy Personnel Command notified you that a review of your Official Military Personnel File (OMPF), and the documents provided did not support changing your HOR to █. As documented on NAVPERS 1070/74, Officer's Report of Home of Record and Place from Which Ordered to a Tour of Active Duty, your official documented HOR is █. On 6 October 2021, you signed a report of home of record and place from which ordered to active duty listing █.

You requested that your HOR reflect █. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions.

However, the Board concluded that your original Report of Home of Record and Place from which Ordered to Active Duty (NAVPERS 1070/74) lists your HOR as █, and that you have not produced additional evidence to indicate an error was made in the original election of you HOR. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the advisory opinion.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
