

A review of your record indicates you received an active duty commission on 20 May 2000 and served on active duty until discharged on 1 November 2012. You served in the Navy Reserve from 4 January 2013 through 30 April 2021 and thereafter, transferred to the Retired Reserve without pay effective 1 May 2021 with 20-years, 9-month, and 9-days of qualifying service. Per Bureau of Naval Personnel Instruction 1001.39F, you will be able to apply to transfer to the Retired Reserve with pay at age 60. Defense Finance and Accounting Service will include time served in USUHS as creditable service when computing your retired pay as outlined in DODFMR 7000.14R. Therefore, the Board concluded your DD Form 214 was properly issued with the inclusive period of 20 May 2000 through 1 November 2012 and does not warrant correction.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
