3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following

a. On 15 August 2015 Petitioner marries active duty spouse. On 23 September 2015 their two children are born. Records indicate the Petitioner's spouse claims the children for BAH purposes.

b. On 22 October 2018 Petitioner begins receiving BAH at the single rate for PDS zip code Petitioner's Master Military Pay Account (MMPA) reflects the Petitioner has received this type of BAH

c. On 28 October 2018 Petitioner's active duty spouse is released from active duty and transferred to

d. On 29 January 2021 Petitioner's spouse files for divorce. No indication of non-spousal support on

e. On 14 May 2021 Petitioner's divorce is finalized. Petitioner's formal spouse has sole custody of two dependent children with requirement for Petitioner to pay monthly child support payments

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded the Petitioner was not paid the appropriate BAH rate per reference (b) effective 29 October 2018 vice the Petitioner's request of 18 October 2018, warranting partial relief.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Effective 29 October 2018 Petitioner authorized BAH at the with dependent rate vice the single rate for PDS zip code through 14 May 2021.

Effective 15 May 2021 Petitioner authorized BAH at the with dependent rate for PDS zip code based on Differential (BAH DIFF) and BAH at the single rate authorization.

Note: Should the Petitioner's authorization for BAH at the single rate be terminated Petitioner would only be entitled to BAH DIFF based on continued child support for dependent children.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
