1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to reflect he was discharged from the naval reserves on 2 March 2020.

Enclosures (1) through (3) apply.

2. The Board, consisting of ██████████, ██████████, and ██████████ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 31 January 2022, and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy and entered active duty on 10 December 2019. On 6 February 2020, Petitioner was counseled regarding his inability to successfully complete recruit training command baseline physical. Petitioner was notified at that time further deficiencies may result in administrative separation.

c. On 14 February 2020, Petitioner was notified of the initiation of the initiation of administrative separation proceedings by reason of entry level performance and conduct-unsatisfactory performance and conduct (66 days from date of entry), at which point, he waived his right to consult with counsel.

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e. On 21 February 2020, the discharge authority approved and directed Petitioner's discharge. Subsequently, Petitioner was discharge with an uncharacterized character of service by reason of entry level performance and conduct, and issued a RE-8 reentry code. At the time of his discharge, Petitioner was issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) which reflects the aforementioned discharge.

f. Petitioner contends he is attempting to enlist in another branch of service however his record reflect he is currently a member of the United States Navy Reserve (USNR). Petitioner contends he is unable to process through a military entrance processing station due to his current USNR status. The Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) erroneously reflects Petitioner is a current member of the USNR.

## CONCLUSION

The Board reviewed the Petitioner's record, noted certain information systems/data bases do not correctly reflect Petitioner's discharge from the Navy. Based on this evidence, the Board determined there is sufficient evidence to support Petitioner's request to have his record reflect he is not currently a member of the USNR. In this regard, the Board found Petitioner's request warrants full relief.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

## RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action: Navy Personnel Command, PERS-313/836 take appropriate action to update Petitioner's record to reflect his discharge from naval service. This includes, but is not limited to, ensuring all information systems/database entries do not reflect that Petitioner is currently a member of the USNR.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulation, Section 723.6(e)) and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of reference (a), has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
