Dear █:

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 8 March 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion by Navy Personnel Command (PERS-312) of 10 February 2022, which was previously provided to you for comment.

On 31 August 1976, you were born at █. On 3 June 1994, you graduated from █. In August 1994, your signed DD Form 398-2 (DoD National Agency Questionnaire) listed your address as █. On 4 May 1995, you signed a Record of Emergency Data listing you father residing in █ and your mother in █. On 4 May 1995, you signed a DD Form 1966 (Record of Military Processing Armed Forces of the U.S.) listed a home of record of █. On 4 May 1995, you signed a DD Form 4 (Enlistment / Reenlistment Document Armed Forces of the U.S.) listing a home of record of █. On 27 September 1995, you entered active duty.

In accordance with the Joint Federal Travel Regulations, the place recorded as the home of the individual when commissioned, appointed, enlisted, inducted, or ordered into the relevant tour of active duty. The place recorded as the home of the individual when reinstated, reappointed, or reenlisted remains the same as that recorded when commissioned, appointed, enlisted or inducted or ordered into the relevant tour of active duty unless there is a break in service of more than one full day. Only if a break in service exceeds one full day, can the Home of Record (HOR) be changed by the member. Travel and transportation allowances are based on the officially

corrected recording in those instances when, through a bona fide error, the place originally named at time of current entry into the Service wasn't in fact the actual home. Any such correction must be fully justified and the home, as corrected, must be the actual home of the member upon entering the Service, and not a different place selected for the member's convenience.

On 8 October 2020, COMNAVPERSCOM notified COMOPTEVFOR that your request for transfer to Fleet Reserve was approved and was being processed for 30 April 2022.

On 13 September 2021, Commander, Navy Personnel Command notified you regarding your request to change HOR to █. A review of your Official Military Personnel File (OMPF), and the documents provided did not support changing your HOR. As documented on your Enlistment/Reenlistment Document Armed Forces of the United States (DD Form 4/1), your official documented HOR is █

In accordance with your Member Data Summary (NSIPS (Standard Integrated Personnel System)/ESR (Electronic Service Record)) your HOR is listed as █

You requested that your HOR be changed to █ the Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that your DD Form 4, signed on 4 May 1995, listed your home of record as █. Furthermore, your DD Form 1966, also signed on 4 May 1995, listed a current address of █ however, it listed your home of record as █. The Board concluded that there is no justification for changing your HOR from █. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the advisory opinion.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
