This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

Although your application was not filed in a timely manner, the Board found it in the interest of justice to waive the statute of limitations and consider your case on its merits. A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 22 February 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

On 10 September 1982 you enlisted for 6 years in the Naval Reserve with an Expiration of Obligated Service of 9 September 1988. On 24 September 1982 you entered active duty for 4 years. On 25 April 1983 you arrived to [REDACTED] for duty with a homeport of [REDACTED]. On 19 April 1984, while on [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]), you crossed the equator enroute to the [REDACTED], and on 26 April 1985 you transferred. On 30 May 1985 you arrived to the [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) for duty, and transferred on 17 September 1986. On 25 September 1986 you were honorably released from active duty and transferred to the Naval Reserve and were honorably discharged on 23 September 1988.

You requested that your Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) reflect the time served on the [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) from 1983 to 1985. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that in accordance with NAVMILPERSCOMINST 1900.1B there is no requirement to list your history of assignments while on active duty, only the last duty assignment/major command, station where separated, and command to which transferred.

In the absence of sufficient new evidence for reconsideration, the decision of the Board is final, and your only recourse would be to seek relief, at no cost to the Board, from a court of appropriate jurisdiction.
