CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of references (b)¹ and (c)², the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that in accordance with reference (b), Petitioner's time spent in and during his current active service period should have been listed as Foreign Service in Block 12f of his DD Form 214 effective 23 November 1991. Both locations are listed in reference (c).

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner will be issued a DD Form 215, Correction to DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty listed block 12f (Foreign Service) "00 06 29" vice "00 00 00".

That no further changes be made to Petitioner's naval record.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
