This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 9 August 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion by Commander, Naval Supply Systems Command letter 5420 Ser SUP 04/041 of 3 June 2022, which was previously provided to you. You were afforded an opportunity to submit a rebuttal, but did not do so.

In accordance with Joint Travel Regulations (2021), a service member is authorized Professional Books, Papers, and Equipment (PBP&E) when he or she certifies that the PBP&E are necessary for official duty at the next permanent duty station (PDS). The next PDS includes the home of record or home of selection upon leaving the service. PBP&E must be declared at the origin of the shipment, and must be documented (to include certification or approval) according to agency or service transportation procedures. The weight of PBP&E is not included in the maximum authorized household goods weight allowance. The PBP&E maximum weight allowed is limited to 2,000 pounds net weight.

The authorized Permanent Change of Station (PCS) weight allowance is normally determined by a service member's grade on the effective date of the PCS order, and whether or not the service member has dependents on the effective date of the PCS order. PCS and non-temporary storage weight allowances for an E-5 with dependents is 9000 pounds.
