3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.

c. SNM enlisted in the U.S. Naval Reserve on 18 November 1943 and was discharged with an Honorable characterization of service on 8 December 1943.

d. Petitioner contends SNM's middle name is incorrectly documented on her Honorable discharge certificate and, although her mother is deceased, she would like it corrected.

Petitioner submitted SNM's honorable discharge certificate, birth certificate, death certificate, official military personnel file documents, and a VitalChek Receipt from County Registrar/Recorder for consideration. In regard to the Petitioner's request to correct the spelling of SNM's middle name, the Board determined relief is warranted based on the evidence submitted.
