This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 17 May 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion by Commander, Naval Supply Systems Command letter 5420 Ser SUP 04/034 of 4 May 2022 which was previously provided to you for comment which you provided a rebuttal to said advisory.

You requested an indebtedness for your permanent change of station move be removed. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. The Board noted that the household goods (HHG) audit team re-audited your claim due to your correct rank and the addition of professional books, papers and equipment. The Board also noted that no evidence was provided to dispute that your weight of your HHG were under your authorized weight, in accordance with the Joint Travel Regulation, Table 5-37. The Board concurred with the advisory opinion, and recommended that you submit a Remission of Indebtedness application (DD Form 2789) to the Chief of Naval Personnel (N130C) if this debt creates a financial hardship.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
