



General, Marine Corps Recruit Depot [REDACTED] Recruiting Region recommended that your promotion be revoked. On 9 July 2021, you acknowledged this recommendation and signed a statement of understanding as well as a personal statement. As a result, the Board concluded you were offered all the due process required by the applicable Marine Corps Order. Finally, the Board considered your contention that you were seeing a counselor for stressors in your personal and professional life, however, you provided no evidence in support of this claim. Regardless, based on your documented misconduct, the Board did not find this mitigation sufficient to overturn CMC's decision to revoke your promotion to Staff Sergeant. The Board thus concluded that your request is lacking in substantial evidence of error or injustice to warrant reinstating your promotion to Staff Sergeant. Accordingly, given the totality of the circumstances, the Board determined that your request does not merit relief.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
