This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

Although your application was not filed in a timely manner, the Board found it in the interest of justice to waive the statute of limitations and consider your case on its merits. A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 25 May 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

In accordance with BUPERSINST 1900.2, 17 April 1953, the Department of Defense Form 214 (DD Form 214) shall be prepared and issued to all personnel at the time of separation of active service. This form shall not be issued in the case of personnel who (1) are found physically disqualified for active duty upon first reporting therefor, (2) are separated from active duty by reason of death, and (3) are separated from active duty for training.

On 19 June 1954, you enlisted for 8 years in the U.S. Naval Reserve with an Expiration of Obligated Service (EOS) of 18 June 1962. Furthermore, transferred this date to the Commanding Officer, U.S. Naval Air Station, [REDACTED] for 90 days Special Active Duty for Training, commencing 0800 19 June 1954. In accordance with your Drill Attendance Record, you completed your Special Active Duty for Training on 16 September 1954. On 27 June 1955, you were honorably discharged from the U.S. Naval Reserve. On 28 June 1955, you entered active duty for 4 years with an End of Active Obligated Service of 27 June 1959. On 26 June 1959, you were honorably released from active duty and transferred to the inactive Naval Reserve.

You requested a DD Form 214 for your active duty service from 19 June 1954 to 16 September 1954. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that according to BUPERSINST 1900.2, you were serving on active duty for training, therefore, you are not eligible to be issued a DD Form 214 for that period of service.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
