1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that her naval record be corrected to adjust her reenlistment code from RE-4 to RE-6. Enclosures (1) through (3) apply.

2. The Board, consisting of █, █, and █ reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 25 March 2022, and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of his naval service records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.

c. Petitioner enlisted in the Navy and began a period of active duty on 6 January 2016.

d. Petitioner Evaluation Report & Counseling (NAVPERS 1616/26) for the period from 16 July 2016 to 15 July 2017 Petitioner's trait average was 3.33, and Petitioner was recommended for retention.

e. Petitioner Evaluation Report & Counseling (NAVPERS 1616/26) for the period from

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16 July 2017 to 15 July 2018 Petitioner's trait average was 3.36, and Petitioner was recommended for retention.

f. Petitioner Evaluation Report & Counseling (NAVPERS 1616/26) for the period from 16 July 2018 to 23 January 2019. Petitioner's trait average was 3.50, and Petitioner was recommended for retention.

g. Petitioner was honorably discharged from active service on 5 February 2022 and issued a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214), by reason of non-retention on active duty, and issued a RE-4 reentry code.

h. Petitioner contends she received an honorable discharge and would like to join the Reserves, however her current reentry code of RE-4 prevents her from reenlistment.

CONCLUSION

The Board reviewed Petitioner's OMPF and notes Petitioner's has no disciplinary infractions, was recommended for retention, and had the sufficient trait average to receive a waivable reentry code. The Board found there is insufficient evidence in Petitioner's record to reflect that she should have been issued a reentry code to prevent her from reenlistment. In this regard, the Board found Petitioner's request warrants partial relief. The Board determined she is entitled to adjustment to her reenlistment code from RE-4 to RE-3M, to allow Petitioner to pursue reenlistment.

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action.

RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action: Petitioner be issued a Correction to Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 215) to indicate a reentry code of "RE-3M."

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(c) it is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
