Dear Petitioner:

This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Title 10, United States Code, Section 1552. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

Although your application was not filed in a timely manner, the Board found it in the interest of justice to waive the statute of limitations and consider your application on its merits. A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 13 June 2022. The names and votes of the panel members will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of the Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record, applicable statutes, regulations, and policies, to include the 25 July 2018 guidance from the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness regarding equity, injustice or clemency determinations (Wilkie Memo).

You enlisted in the Navy and began a period of active duty on 27 October 1976. On 24 October 1980, you were discharged with an Honorable characterization of service and transferred to the Naval Reserve. On 3 November 1981, you began a second period of active duty. On 22 July 1982, you received nonjudicial punishment (NJP) for disobeying a lawful order. On 7 October 1982, you began a period of unauthorized absence (UA) which lasted 3 hours and 15 minutes. On 14 October 1982, you received a second NJP for a period of UA. On 7 April 1983, you received a third NJP for unlawful use and possession of a controlled substance. On 10 May 1983, you were counseled for civilian and military offenses, disrespect towards superiors, financial problems, and job performance not completed in a timely manner. You were advised that failure to take corrective action could result in administrative separation. On 17 October 1983, you began a second period of UA which lasted 1 hour. On 4 November 1983, you received fourth NJP for UA and failure to obey a lawful order from a superior officer. On 9 November 1983, you were notified of the initiation of administrative separation proceedings by reason of misconduct
