1. Pursuant to the provisions of the reference, Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner's next of kin, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting a correction to his father's social security number listed on his Report of Separation from Active Duty (DD Form 214), block 3.

2. The Board, consisting of █, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 25 April 2022, and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosure, relevant portions of the Petitioner's father naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.

b. Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to review the application on its merits.

c. Petitioner's father enlisted in the Marine Corps and began a period of active duty on 4 October 1974. On 7 July 1976, he was released from active duty.

d. Petitioner asserts that his father's social security number, which is stated in his original DD Form 214 as █ should have actually been █. Petitioner provided a copy of his father's social security card with his petition.

RECOMMENDATION

Petitioner's father naval record be corrected by changing the his social security number on his DD Form 214 from [REDACTED] to [REDACTED]

Petitioner be provided a copy of the corrected DD Form 214.

That no further action be granted.

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
