
This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

Although your application was not filed in a timely manner, the Board found it in the interest of justice to waive the statute of limitations and consider your case on its merits. A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 24 May 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

On 9 December 1966 you enlisted for 6 years in the U.S. Naval Reserve with an Expiration of Obligated Service (EOS) of 8 December 1972. On 26 October 1967 you entered active duty based on the following documents: Administrative Remarks (NAVPERS 601-13), History of Assignments (NAVPERS 601-5), Leave Record (NAVPERS 601-8), and Enlisted Performance Record (NAVPERS 601). On 15 November 1967 Naval Training Center, San Diego, CA notified Chief of Naval Personnel via Commander, Naval Training Center and Chief, Bureau of Medicine and Surgery found you unfit for duty. On 17 November 1967 you were honorably discharged via convenience of government. Furthermore, you were not recommended for reenlistment. Authority: BUPERS Manual Article C-10306 and BUMED Instruction 1910.2D.

You requested to correct your Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty—DD Form 214¹ to reflect you served from 9 December 1966 to 17 November 1967. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that when you signed your enlistment

contract on 9 December 1966 you were in an inactive status and did not enter active duty until 26 October 1967.

You are entitled to have the Board reconsider its decision upon submission of new matters, which will require you to complete and submit a new DD Form 149. New matters are those not previously presented to or considered by the Board. In this regard, it is important to keep in mind that a presumption of regularity attaches to all official records. Consequently, when applying for a correction of an official naval record, the burden is on the applicant to demonstrate the existence of probable material error or injustice.
