This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 14 July 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board considered the advisory opinion by Navy Personnel Command letter 5730 PERS-91 of 27 May 2022 which was previously provided to you for comment.

The Board determined that your personal appearance, with or without counsel, would not materially add to their understanding of the issues involved. Therefore, the Board determined that a personal appearance was not necessary and considered your case based on the evidence of record.

You requested to retire with 25 total years of qualifying service (TYQS) and receive points for various Annual Training (AT) orders completed. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. The Board concluded that you do not meet the criteria to retire with 25 TYQS in accordance with Bureau of Naval Personnel Instruction 1001.39F. Specifically, the policy indicates the full year periods used for the crediting of qualifying years for non-regular retirement shall be based on the established anniversary year. A member who has a break in service that occurs during an anniversary year may be credited with a partial year of qualifying service for non-regular retirement. However, the member must meet the minimum retirement point requirements outlined in the policy—members with 95 to 102 days in an active status are required to complete a minimum of 14 points.
