1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish advancement to Information Systems Technician Submarines Second Class (ITS2)/E-5 from the September 2020 (Cycle 248) Navy-wide Advancement Exam (NWAE).

2. The Board, consisting of **Construction**, **Construction**, and **Construction** reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 19 May 2022 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. On 29 January 2016, Petitioner awarded Associate of Applied Science degree from Community College; degree is reflected in Petitioner's Joint Services Transcript record.

b. Petitioner's Active Duty Service Date is 20 November 2018.

c. Petitioner advanced to Information Systems Technician Submarines Third Class/E-4 effective 16 June 2020 with a time in rate (TIR) date of 1 January 2020.

d. In September 2020, Petitioner participated in Cycle 248 NWAE and passed not advanced; Examination Profile Information and Exam Status sheet reflects zero (0) education points.

## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. In accordance with references (b)<sup>1</sup> and (c), Petitioner met the criteria to receive two education points; however, the points were not accounted for at the time Petitioner participated in the September 2020 (Cycle 248) NWAE. Although the proper administrative requirements were not completed, the Board felt that under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

## RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner's Examination Profile Information and Exam Status sheet from the September 2020 (Cycle 248) NWAE is modified to read Education is "2" vice "0" and Final Multiple Score is "95.77" vice "93.77." Note: The Minimum Multiple Required was 95.02.

Petitioner advanced to ITS2/E-5 effective 16 June 2021 with a TIR date of 1 January 2021.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
