1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish Petitioner's effective date of BUPERS Order 0332 (Official Separation Orders) to a date acceptable for Personally Procured Move (PPM) of Household Goods (HHG) shipment claim processing and payment per reference (b).

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 19 May 2022 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. On 21 January 2022 Petitioner rents UHAUL equipment and has Certified Weight Scales with dates from this date through 30 January 2022.

b. On 26 January 2022 Petitioner released from active duty and issued DD Form 214.

c. On 2 February 2022 Petitioner issued BUPERS Order 0332 (Official Separation Orders) reflecting actual discharge date of 26 January 2022.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded the Petitioner should have received his separations orders before he was separated in order to move his HHG, therefore, his orders should reflect that his orders were issued in time to execute his HHG shipment.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

BUPERS Order 0332 (Official Separation Orders) issued 20 January 2022 vice 2 February 2022.
Petitioner authorized to submit HHG claim utilizing funding from BUPERS Order 0332.

Note to Petitioner: You are advised to resubmit your personally procured move claim, orders, receipts, and a copy of the Board of Correction of Naval Records' decision to the Household Good Audit Team (HHG-AT) for re-adjudication. That no further changes be made to Petitioner's naval record.

That a copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
