This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 18 August 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. In addition, the Board also considered the advisory opinion (AO) by Navy Personnel Command memorandum 1780 PERS-311 of 12 July 2022, which was previously provided to you. You were afforded an opportunity to submit a rebuttal, but did not do so.

You requested your record be corrected to reflect enrollment in the Montgomery GI Bill (MGIB) Program. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that the election to participate in or decline MGIB is irrevocable in accordance with Title 38, United States Code, Chapter 30. A review of your record indicates you entered active duty on 14 September 2001 and declined participation in the MGIB program on 19 September 2001. By signing DD Form 2366, Montgomery GI Bill Act of 1984 (MGIB) – Basic Enrollment, block 5, Statement of Disenrollment you acknowledged understanding the benefits of the MGIB program and that you would not be able to enroll at a later date, thereby rendering you ineligible to change your election. In this connection, the Board substantially concurred with the comments contained in the advisory opinion.

The Board noted that Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act (Post-9/11 GI Bill, Public Law 110-252) was signed into law on 30 June 2008 and became effective on 1 August 2009. The bill provides financial support for education and housing for service members with at least
