1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to show that block 17c of the Armed Forces of the United States Report of Transfer or Discharge (DD Form 214N) ending on 9 December 1971 reflects "4 January 1968" vice "4 January 1969".

2. The Board, consisting of **an an applicable statutes**, regulations, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 11 October 2022 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. On 5 December 1967 Petitioner enlisted in the U.S Naval Reserve for 6 years with an expiration of obligated service of 4 December 1973.

b. On 4 January 1968 Petitioner entered active duty for 4 years with an end of active obligated service of 3 January 1972.

c. Petitioner was released from active duty and transfer to the Naval Reserve with an honorable character of service and was issued a DD Form 214N for the period of 4 January 1969 to 9 December 1971 upon release from active duty within 3 months of active obligated service.

d. On 4 December 1973 Petitioner was honorably discharged from the U.S. Naval Reserve.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of reference (b)¹ and enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Block 17c is incorrect on Petitioner's DD Form 214N executed 9 December 1971, listing 4 January 1969 as his date of entry. Petitioner entered active duty on 4 January 1968.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner will be issued a DD Form 215 to his DD Form 214N executed on 9 December 1971, block 17c (date of entry) was "4 January 1968" vice "4 January 1969." Note: That any other entries affected by the Board's recommendation be corrected.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.



¹ Reference (b), the DD Form 214 is designed to provide the individual being released, transferred, or discharged from active duty with documentary evidence of active military service. Furthermore, the DD Form 214 will be issued to all personnel at the time of release from active service including active duty for training of 90 days or more.
