1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting his naval record be corrected by issuing a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 214) for a missing period of active duty service.

2. The Board, consisting of **Constitution** reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 23 August 2022 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:

a. On 17 April 1981 Petitioner entered active duty for 4 years with an end of active obligated service (EAOS) of 16 April 1985 and soft end of active obligated service of 16 April 1986.

b. Petitioner was discharged with an honorable character of service and was issued a DD Form 214 for the period of 17 April 1981 to 13 April 1986 upon separation for immediate reenlistment.

c. 14 April 1986 Petitioner reenlisted for 4 years with an EAOS of 13 April 1990.

d. On 23 February 1990 Petitioner reenlisted for 4 years with an EAOS of 22 February 1994.

e. Petitioner was discharged with an honorable character of service and was issued a DD Form 214 for the period of 23 February 1990 to 12 July 1991.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner served on active duty without a break in service from 17 April 1981 to 12 July 1991. In accordance with reference (b),¹ Petitioner should have been issued a DD Form 214 upon his reenlistment on 14 April 1986 because he was discharged for the purpose of immediate enlistment or reenlistment; however, none could be found in his service record.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner was issued a DD Form 214 for the period of "14 April 1986" to "22 February 1990" due to immediate reenlistment.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.



¹ Reference (b), a DD Form 214 is prepared to cover periods of service on active duty, temporary active duty, some periods of active duty for training, certain periods terminated by a change of status not concurrent with separation from active service, and release from a status that is legally determined to be void. The DD Form 214 will be prepared and furnished to members while serving on active duty when they have a change of status or component as follows: Discharged for the purpose of immediate enlistment or reenlistment.
