This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to Section 1552 of Title 10, United States Code. After careful and conscientious consideration of relevant portions of your naval record and your application, the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board) found the evidence submitted insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice. Consequently, your application has been denied.

A three-member panel of the Board, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 2 August 2022. The names and votes of the members of the panel will be furnished upon request. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, relevant portions of your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

The Board determined that your personal appearance, with or without counsel, would not materially add to their understanding of the issues involved. Therefore, the Board determined that a personal appearance was not necessary and considered your case based on the evidence of record.

You requested transfer to the Retired Reserve. The Board, in its review of your entire record and application, carefully weighed all potentially mitigating factors, to include your assertions. However, the Board concluded that you did not meet the criteria of Title 10 U.S.C. 12731(a)(2) to warrant correction to your record. Specifically, Title 10 U.S.C. 12731 indicates a person is entitled, upon application, to retired pay if the person has performed at least 20 years of service computed under section 12732. Title 10 U.S.C. 12732 requires service members to be in a reserve component to be eligible to apply for a non-regular retirement. A review of your record indicates you resigned your commission upon notification of administrative processing for misconduct and on 15 March 2014, you discharged with a total of 19 years and 12 days of active duty service. At the time of this discharge, you previously earned 1 year, 8 months, and 14 days of qualifying service in the Navy Reserve. The Board noted that you cumulatively completed
