## CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2) and reference (b), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded that Petitioner was released from active duty on 15 June 2022, however, his DD Form 214 lists his separation date in block 12b as 20 January 2022.

## RECOMMENDATION


That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

The Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active duty (DD Form 214) dated 15 June 2022 listed block 12b (Separation date this period) "15 June 2022" vice "20 January 2022." Note: That any other entries affected by the Board's recommendation be corrected.

Additionally, block 4a (Grade, rate or rank) "CAPT" vice "1STLT," block 4b (Pay grade) "O3" vice "O2," and block 12i (Effective date of pay grade) "2022 06 01" vice "2020 05 04."

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
