1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to reflect Home of Record (HOR) as [REDACTED] on DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty ending on 21 November 2007.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 8 September 2022 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, she exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. On 17 March 1988, Petitioner enlisted in the Naval Reserve for a term of 8 years. DD Form 4, Enlistment/Reenlistment Document listed HOR as [REDACTED]

b. Petitioner served on active duty from 24 May 1988 through 4 August 1996; DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active duty listed HOR as [REDACTED]

c. On 20 August 1996, Petitioner enlisted in the Naval Reserve for a term of 2 years. DD Form 4, Enlistment/Reenlistment Document listed HOR as [REDACTED]

d. On 11 January 1998, Petitioner reenlisted in the Navy Reserve for a term of 2 years. NAVPERS 1070/601, Immediate Reenlistment Contract listed HOR as [REDACTED]

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e. On 5 December 1999, Petitioner reenlisted in the Navy Reserve for a term of 2 years. NAVPERS 1070/601, Immediate Reenlistment Contract listed HOR as [REDACTED]

f. On 7 October 2001, Petitioner reenlisted in the Navy Reserve for a term of 2 years. NAVPERS 1070/601, Immediate Reenlistment Contract listed HOR as [REDACTED]

g. On 9 August 2003, Petitioner reenlisted in the Navy Reserve for a term of 2 years. NAVPERS 1070/601, Immediate Reenlistment Contract listed HOR as [REDACTED]

h. On 1 October 2005, Petitioner was assigned to Navy Operational Support Center (NOSC) [REDACTED] Navy Reserve Operational Support Unit [REDACTED]

i. On 17 July 2005, Petitioner reenlisted in the Navy Reserve for a term of 6 years.

j. On 15 November 2006, Petitioner issued BUPERS Mobilization Order: 3196. Orders reflect Petitioner's recalled to active duty from [REDACTED]

k. On 5 January 2007, Petitioner report to Navy Mobilization Processing Site [REDACTED] for temporary duty.

l. On 19 January 2007, Petitioner issued Mobilization Order Modification correcting HOR to [REDACTED]

m. On 19 September 2007, Petitioner issued BUPERS Demobilization Order: 2627. Order reflect Petitioner's release from active duty orders to [REDACTED]

n. On 21 November 2007, Petitioner was released from active duty and transferred to the Navy Reserve. DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty, Block 7b (Home of Record at Time of Entry) [REDACTED]

o. On 15 May 2011, Petitioner reenlisted in the Navy Reserve for a term of 6 years. NAVPERS 1070/601, Immediate Reenlistment Contract listed HOR as [REDACTED]

p. Petitioner transferred to the Retired Reserve without pay from NOSC [REDACTED] Navy Reserve [REDACTED] unit effective 1 August 2015.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded Petitioner provided sufficient evidence of executing BUPERS Mobilization Order: [REDACTED] Although the proper administrative requirements were not completed, the Board felt, under these circumstances, relief is warranted.

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RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

Petitioner issued DD Form 215, Correction to DD Form 214, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty ending on 21 November 2007 modifying Block 7b (Home of Record at Time of Entry) '[REDACTED] vice '[REDACTED]

Note: Additional changes to Petitioner's OMPF may be required based on this change.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
