1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject, hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with the Board for Correction of Naval Records (Board), requesting that his naval record be corrected to establish authorization to receive Pass Not Advanced (PNA) points from the March 2021 (Cycle 251) Navy Wide Advancement Exam (NWAE). Additionally, Petitioner request advancement to Aviation Electrician's Mate First Class (AE1)/E-6 from the March 2022 (Cycle 255) NWAE.

2. The Board, consisting of [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 29 September 2022 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, relevant portions of Petitioner's naval record, and applicable statutes, regulations, and policies.

3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, found that, before applying to this Board, he exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy. The Board made the following findings:

a. In accordance with reference (b), Commanding Officers may request standard score comparison exception to policy (ETP) no later than 6 months after the missed exams limiting date.

b. Reference (c) specifies, PNA point will only accumulate for the three previous advancement cycles.

c. Petitioner completed Professional Military Knowledge Eligibility Exam for E-6 on 18 April 2019.

d. Petitioner detached [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]) 122 on 11 January 2021 and reported to [REDACTED] on 5 March 2021. However, Petitioner contends she reported to the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] on 12 February 2021 due [REDACTED] being deployed. Petitioner asserts there was a mix up with the exam that rendered her unable to participate in the March 2021 (Cycle 251) NWAE due to no fault of her own.

e. In September 2021, Petitioner participated in the Cycle 252 NWAE and passed not advanced with 1.5 points; final multiple score (FMS) was 135.57. The minimum required multiple (MMR) for advancement to AE1/E-6 was 138.62.

f. In March 2022, Petitioner participated in Cycle 255 NWAE and passed not advanced with 1.5 points; FMS was 135.43. The MMR for advancement to AE1/E-6 was 135.93.

g. On 23 September 2022, [REDACTED] submitted an ETP to the Director, Military Personnel Plans and Policy (N132C) requesting to compare Petitioner's Cycle 251 Enlisted Advancement Worksheet against Cycle 251 FMS due to her inability to participate because of circumstances beyond her control. Additionally, the ETP requested Petitioner's PNA points be applied to her Cycle 255 FMS for advancement to AE1/E-6.

h. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the specific request is in error however if a cycle comparison is requested it would have merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action. The Board concluded the Petitioner was not provided an opportunity to participate in the March 2021 (Cycle 251) NWAE due to no fault of her own thus warranting relief.

RECOMMENDATION

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that:

After comparison of September 2021 (Cycle 252) NWAE to the March 2021 (Cycle 251) NWAE, Petitioner received the following scores: Standard Score 48.29; Performance Mark Average (PMA) 4.67/80.10; Service in Pay Grade (SIPG) (0400)/00.80; Awards 04.00; Education 0.00; PNA 1.50; and FMS 136.19. The MMR for advancement to AE1/E-6 for Cycle 251 NWAE was 141.29.

Petitioner's Examination Profile Information and Exam Status sheet from the September 2021 (Cycle 252) NWAE is amended to reflect the addition of 1.5 PNA points from March 2021 (Cycle 251) NWAE; PNA "4.50" vice "3.00"; and FMS "137.07" vice "135.57." The MMR for advancement to AE1/E-6 for Cycle 252 NWAE was 138.62.

Petitioner's Examination Profile Information and Exam Status sheet from the March 2022 (Cycle 255) NWAE is amended to reflect the addition of 1.5 PNA points from March 2021 (Cycle 251) NWAE; PNA "4.50" vice "3.00"; FMS "136.93" vice "135.43"; and Final Status "Selected" vice "PNA-PTS 0.0/1.5." Note: Date of advancement to AE1/E-6 to be determined by Navy Personnel Command.

A copy of this Report of Proceedings will be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. It is certified that a quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above-entitled matter.

5. Pursuant to the delegation of authority set out in Section 6(e) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(e)), and having assured compliance with its provisions, it is hereby announced that the foregoing corrective action, taken under the authority of the reference, has been approved by the Board on behalf of the Secretary of the Navy.
