	e Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of and injustice, finds as follows:
	Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
	Although enclosure (1) was not filed in a timely manner, it is in the interest of justice to the application on its merits.
c.	Petitioner enlisted in the U.S. Navy and began a period of active duty on 4 June 1959.
d.	On 12 September 1961, Petitioner was assigned to Naval Air Station,

# Subj: REVIEW OF NAVAL RECORD OF FORMER MEMBER Recruiting Station, for separation processing at the expiration of his active obligated service. On 5 April 1963, Petitioner was discharged from active duty and transferred to the Naval Reserves.

- e. At the time of his discharge, Petitioner was issued a DD Form 214 that indicated his entitlement to the Expert Pistol Medal, Expert Rifle Medal, and Good Conduct Medal. Additionally his SSN was indicated as
- f. On 17 October 2022, NPC completed an AO and determined the Petitioner is entitled to the Navy Expeditionary Medal. Further, the AO concluded that the Petitioner's service record does not contain evidence to support a correction to his SSN.

### CONCLUSION:

Upon review and consideration of the evidence of record, the Board determined Petitioner's request warrants partial relief.

The Board concurred with the AO and determined that Petitioner is entitled to the Navy Expeditionary Medal for his service on the Board agreed that there is insufficient evidence to support a correction to his SSN and denied this portion of his petition. But should Petitioner resubmit his application and provide verification, from the Social Security Administration, of his SSN and the date of issuance, the Board will reevaluate the request.

## RECOMMENDATION:

In view of the above, the Board directs the following corrective action:

That Petitioner be issued a Correction to DD Form 214 Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty (DD Form 215) indicating the addition of the Navy Expeditionary Medal.

That no further changes be made to Petitioner's record.

A copy of this report of proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.
